1. Number of bills reviewed: 44
2. Significant legislation:
 - a. HB 834 – Equal Pay Act of 2003
 - b. SB 1495 – LLC Act cleanup
 - c. SB 1829 – Prohibits nondisclosure agreements for an unlawful employment practice
