**The Administrative Law Section Council reviews proposed legislation that may affect their members' practice area. Highlights of the most recent legislative session include:**

1. Number of bills reviewed: 19
2. Significant legislation:
  - a. SB 220 – Procedural changes in Human Rights Act for real estate transactions.
  - b. SB 1152 – Administrative adjudication for offenses from automated cameras.
  - c. HB 2839 – Right to judicial review.
